Biographical Sketch

Staff Sergeant Christopher Clark is a 92R, Parachute Rigger serving as a demonstration parachutist with the Black Demonstration Team.

After enlisting into the Army in February of 2004 Clark completed Basic Training at Ft Jackson, South Carolina. He was then assigned to the Ft Lee, Virginia to complete his Advanced Individual Training as a Parachute Rigger. By the end of 2004 Clark was at his first assignment on Ft Bragg at the 782nd Quartermaster Battalion, then later he moved on to the 11th Quartermaster.



In 2009 Clark chose to attend the Golden Knight Assessment and Selection Program, which is used by the Knights to assess young skydivers' skills and evaluate their team working abilities. Once he proved himself to be an asset he was 'knighted'. He is now serving as the the Black Team's lead rigger.

Clark Started jumping in July of 2004 and has since logged more than 2,500 freefall parachute jumps, and 29 military static line jumps.

When he is not travelling with the Team Chris enjoys Victorian Home restoration and the design and fabrication of custom motorcycles.
